support networks. Cafés are free to attend and welcome to all.



What: Gil Park is an oil painter currently living in Great Falls. In 1998, Park graduated from



Kangnam University in South Korea, earning a bachelor's degree in Oriental Water and China Ink Painting. He then relocated to the United States in 2004, expanding his artistic repertoire to incorporate Western impressionism and realism.

While working as a portrait and caricature artist at Disneyland park in CA for 13 years, Gil exhibited his artwork at prestigious venues like the Hilbert Museum and several art galleries across Southern California, attracting the attention of collectors. As a member of the Laguna

Plein Air Association, he actively participated in exhibitions and received several awards for his exceptional oil painting skills, including the prestigious "Best of Show" recognition at the 2011 summer San Clemente art gallery show for his oil painting titled "A Gallery Sitter."

HEALTHCARE NAVIGATOR





JOHN KUNZ: JOURNEY TO FREEDOM, THE FLIGHT OF A POLISH FAMILY TO AMERICA





What: Community member John Kunz was born in a Nazi concentration camp. He and his parents survived imprisonment in Germany and arrived in the United States of America as refugees after the war. Kunz was just 6 years old at the time. With the support and sponsorship of a family through the Catholic Church in Fairfield, MT the Kunz family was able to make Great Falls home. After graduating from Central Catholic High School in 1962 he enlisted in the US Marine Corps. Upon discharge as a Sergeant, he lived in New Jersey tending bar at his brother's Polish tayern.




NATIVE AMERICAN HERITAGE MONTH STORY WALK IN GIBSON PARK
